CAREER-FOCUSED RESOURCES FOR EVERY STUDENT

The Locks Career Center provides Moore students and alumnae with comprehensive career support services ranging from résumé advice and career coaching, to assistance in internship preparation, help with networking skills, and job searches. In addition, the Center provides access to valuable resources and information on industry best practices to ensure students' professional development. This support helps artists, educators and designers enhance and improve their employment opportunities and shape their working life.

The Center also maintains an active database of employers and professional contacts in the art and design fields in the Mid-Atlantic region and nationally. A strong network of Moore alumnae maintains a loyal relationship with the College and is included in this database. They are eager to share professional expertise with current students and regularly provide information to the Career Center about employment opportunities and new initiatives in their disciplines.

Through the electronic job bank COOL: Career Opportunities On-Line, graduates may access job opportunities and information on artists' residencies, grants, exhibitions, competitions and community service.

For undergraduate students, Career Center programs are tailored to meet each student's needs across all four years of the BFA curriculum with lifelong resources upon graduation. For masters-level candidates, the Center offers customized career planning in support of their ongoing professional development.

By utilizing the Locks Career Center, students learn how to successfully negotiate their first job offer, navigate career changes and develop positive strategies in addressing professional challenges.

Individualized attention is key in the approach taken by the Locks Career Center. Students work one-on-one with the professional staff to develop their goals and plan for their professional lives as artists, designers, art historians, curators and art educators.

LOCKS CAREER CENTER SERVICES INCLUDE:

- Assistance on making informed choices, developing self-awareness and using self-assessment techniques.
- Guidance on setting goals to make the successful transition from school to a professional career.
- First-Year Focus, an e-newsletter for first-year students.
- Individualized assistance on effective résumé writing, cover letter composition and networking.
- Access to comprehensive resources to help students and alumnae maintain a competitive edge in their respective fields.
- Specialized workshops on such topics as grant writing, freelance basics, pricing artwork and life/career balance.
